6.2 Detailed Study of Relevant Kilkenny County Development Plan Designations

On account of the designation - in the Kilkenny County Development Plan - of views from the road from Ballymartin Crossroads, a separate more detailed study has been undertaken consisting of the measured cross-sections with accompanying photographs that are provided in this appendix.

This section of road has potential views from along approximately 2 km of its length, in practice most of the view is screened by either forestry or tall hedges. Along two lengths - one around 350m in length, the other around 200m in length - a combination of steep slopes and/or a lack of tall vegetation means that uninterrupted panoramic views are available to the south-west, west and north-west.

Three visualisations have been prepared to examine the effect on these views [See following map and photography].


View A shows the northernmost view, where the recent improvement of pasture has removed tall gorse and saplings to expose panoramic views including areas where the OHL will be located. The new structures will be visible from this location and will be seen in the context of a working landscape that contains many visible manmade structures [field boundaries, dwellings and agricultural structures]. This view shows a point where the road and line are closest and is the most northern open panorama. Further north of this point vegetation and topography screen views from the road.

Structures 7 - 18 are distantly visible on the flatter valley bottom that is composed of larger fields with lower hedges. These are seen in the context of a background of the existing substation and co-op structure. Structures 18 - 41 generally follow the start of the transition to the uplands where structures 18 - 27 are seen in the context of smaller fields with taller trees and hedgerows – as well as numerous forestry blocks.

View B shows the view across a longer section of road that has open views. The new structures will be also visible from this location and will be seen in the context of a working landscape that contains many visible manmade structures [field boundaries, dwellings and agricultural structures].

Structures 7 - 18 are distantly visible on the flatter valley bottom that is composed of larger fields with lower hedges. These are seen in the context of a background of the existing substation and co-op structure. Structures 18 - 41 generally follow the start of the transition to the uplands where structures 18 - 27 are seen in the context of smaller fields with taller trees and hedgerows – as well as numerous forestry blocks.

View C shows a typical View south of Ballymartin Cross Roads and it illustrates how there is no visibility from these areas on account of intervening topography.



Location Map








